

The western-style residence and billiard house were both designed by British architect Josiah Conder. These historic buildings, in addition to the Japanese Shoin-style residence, all built in the Meiji era, still stand today, and have been designated as important cultural assets.

1 Nihonbashi

The bridge, which was said to be the symbol of old Edo's prosperity, was the starting point for the five major highways of the Edo period. The Road Origin Marker of Japan (Kilometer 0) is embedded in the center of the bridge.

In the nearby surrounding area, you will find long-established department stores and varios commercial facilities.

The world's only theatre used exclusively for Kabuki was established about 130 years ago. The current building is the fifth reincarnation of the theatre. Performances staged at the theatre since the Meiji era do not stop with classical theatre, but also include plays that incorporate the feeling of modern times.

With a height of 634m, Tokyo Skytree is one of the world's tallest tower. The observation decks located 350m and 450m above ground offer panoramic views of the entire Kanto region. The views are especially beautiful on a cold winter day when the air is clear.

Kiyosumi Gardens was established in the late 19th century by Yataro Iwasak the founder of the Mitsubishi conglomer ate. It is a kaiyu-shiki tsukiyama sans teien (traditional Japanese-style str garden with hills and ponds), and know for its landscape rocks including beauti and oddly shaped ones.






